

#### Learning, developments and things to look out for.....

#### Spring Term 1

Across this half term children have been involved in lots of lovely learning opportunities. Not only have they spent time following their own interests, they have also enjoyed being outdoors cooking over a fire, observing and finding out about different birds who visit our garden, taking part in Lunar New Year celebrations and finding out how to stay safe online.

#### **Outdoor Garden Developments**

Lots of exciting things will be happening in our 3-4 year old garden soon. After our climbing equipment was condemned and removed in the Summer, we have been looking at different options to replace it. We have talked to the children about what they would like, and some children have even documented their ideas. In response to this, we have been in communication with a local company, who have drawn up plans for a number of improvements. These include, adding a new climbing structure, canopy areas, a basket swing, a climb and slide area and an outdoor open classroom. We are really excited and we are hoping that the work will begin in April.

A new canopy area will also be built in our 2-3 year old garden. This will provide a covered outdoor area for our youngest learners.

# Take a book home

Due to Covid-19 and the restrictions on parents accessing our nursery, families have been unable to access our story lending library. In order that books can once again be borrowed, we have purchased a small wooden outdoor storage cupboard. After the February half term holiday, this will be placed in our front garden near to the bench, with a range of books for you to take home and share.

At nursery we promote repeated reading, with children listening to the same story lots of times. This supports them in learning new words and sounds, gaining an understanding of story structures and lets them join in and answer questions. If your child is enjoying a particular book, please feel free to keep it at home and read it as often as you like.

# Staff Training Day

# Hatching Chicks and Ducks

In March we will be welcoming some feathery friends into the world. The children will be able to watch first hand as both chicks and ducks hatch. Together they will learn about the life cycle of these birds and find out how we care for them. As parents are currently unable to come into nursery, we will be adding photographs and videos to the Class Dojo and Facebook site. This is a really exciting and special time in nursery and we ask that parents and families talk to their children about this experience, in order to support their learning.

# A few helpful reminders.....

- Morning nursery sessions begin at 8.45am and finish at 11.45am, afternoon sessions begin at 12.30pm and finish at 3.30pm. Full day children attend between 8.45am and 3,30pm.
- Please ring and let us know as soon as possible if your child is going to be absent
- Inform us if someone different is picking up your child and give them the password
- Complete and return admissions forms and keep us informed if any details change
- Children who attend all day need a healthy packed lunch-please see our Packed Lunch Policy (please add an ice pack as lunches can not be refrigerated)
- Please try to be on time for your child at pick up as they can become distressed and it can often affect staff lunches, breaks or worktime.
- Inform us of any new medical conditions or changes
- School fund is £1 per week. This can be paid weekly or through bank transfer. Please add your child's name as the reference if bank transferring
- Please pay for your care sessions on a weekly, or monthly basis. It is preferred that this is done through bank transfer, including your child's name as the reference.

- Please label your child's belongings with their name
- Nappies and wipes need to be provided for children who require them. Spare clothes should be provided for children who are toilet training in case of accidents.
- Sunscreen should be applied before your child attends nursery on warm days. Sunscreen should be provided for full day children, so it can be reapplied.
- If you would like any nursery jumpers, cardigans or coats, please come to the office. These can be paid for by cash or bank transfer. Jumpers £8, Cardigans £9, Coats £20
